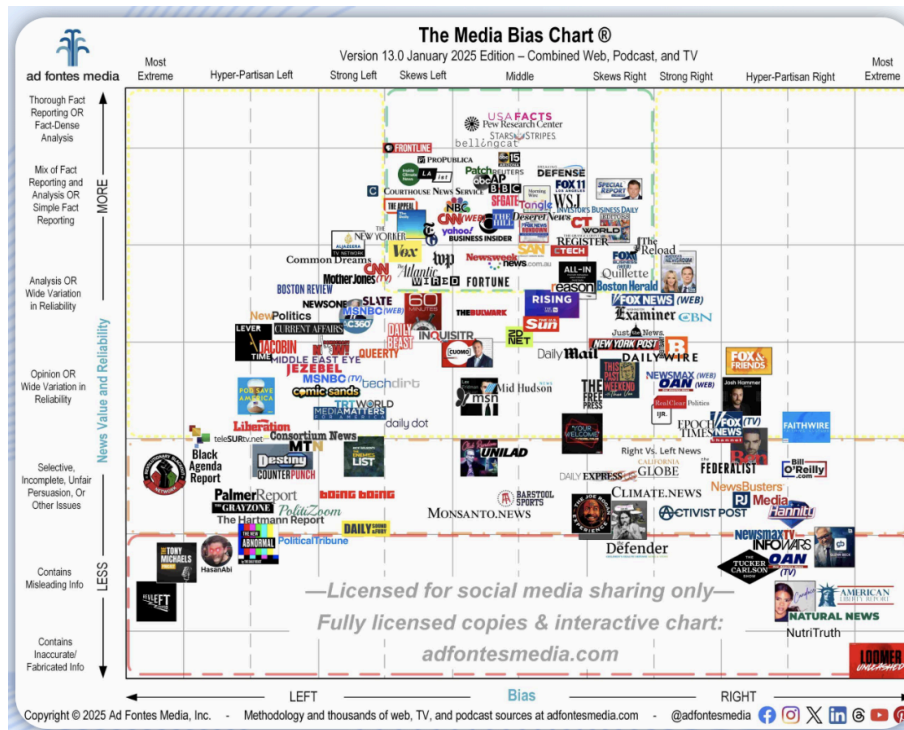

It rates news sources for reliability and tracks bias to help the reader keep track of the media landscape.

All Sides

All Sides display the day's top news stories from the left, center and right of the political spectrum — side-by-side so you can see the full picture.

Curating balanced news and perspectives from across the political spectrum and offering objective summaries helps you to quickly get the full picture, see bias, avoid manipulation and think for yourself. By revealing different perspectives on issues underlying the news cycle and exposing bias and nuance in news coverage, we equip readers to decide for themselves, rather than manipulating them to any one point of view.

The All Sides team intentionally contains diversity in thought, geography, background, and perspective to ensure we aren't omitting or misrepresenting important perspectives.

Flip Side

In an oversaturated and partisan media environment, we're either making incomplete, biased choices about what news to consume ourselves, or we're allowing tech platforms to choose our news for us based on their own values and algorithms.

The Flip Side provides both sides of the most important current issues. In a free daily email, the reader gets the most thoughtful points from the left, right, and in-between, pulled from across 30+ news sources and painstakingly agreed upon by our team of lefties and righties to ensure equal-bias and content accuracy.

The Flip Side focuses on one topic and selects the most thoughtful and well-articulated pieces to highlight each morning in a 5-minute curated email. It is a curator of content and conversation.

Framechange

Framechange's mission is to promote a stronger democracy by reducing polarization. They believe understanding multiple perspectives is the most efficient way to stay informed while developing empathy for those you may not agree with. It

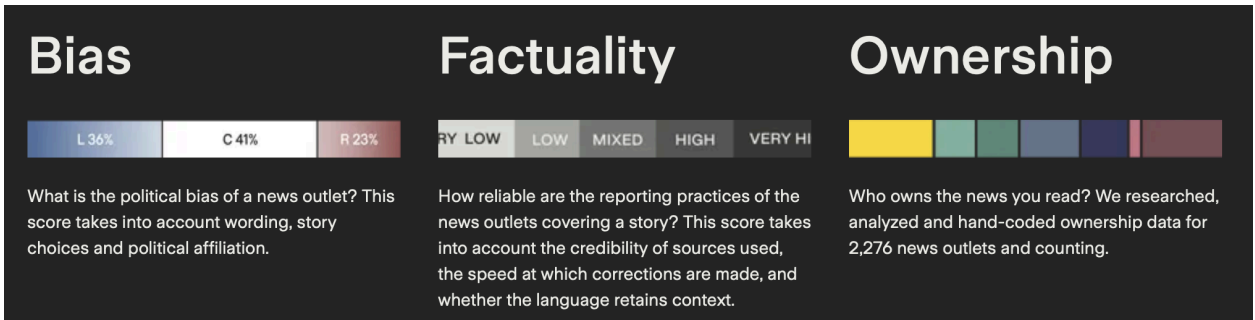
is a nonpartisan publication that brings viewpoints from multiple sides of today's issues to help the reader develop an informed, independent perspective and understand the viewpoints of others. This is a weekly newsletter each having 6 sections:

- What's happening: background and context on the featured topic
- Notable viewpoints
- From the source: links to primary sources
- Be heard: a call to share your viewpoint
- Snippets: Quick-hit headlines for the past week
- Music on the bottom: A fund song recommendation to tie things off

Ground News

Ground News provides tools to help readers compare how different news sources are covering the same story, making it easier for the reader to feel more informed about the news they are consuming.

Ground News identifies every news article written on a recent event, and categorizes the reporting based on the source's political bias, factuality, ownership, geographic location, and chronology. It provides an overview of reporting with the Ground Summary, which highlights the key points from all of the articles reporting on the story, from left, right, and center.



The user can view stories that are minimized or emphasized by only one side off the political spectrum with the Blindspot Feed, which shines a spotlight on lopsided coverage. This puts the reader in a position to choose and easily compare the news they want to read and also get a peek into what’s being reported on opposite sides of the political spectrum.

Ground News is a news comparison platform drawing from more than 40,000 news sources worldwide and featuring an average of 30,000 news stories per day.

Media Bias Fact Check

Media Bias Fact Check (MBFC) selects and publishes fact checks from around the world. They only utilize fact-checkers who are either a signatory of the International Fact-Checking Network (IFCN) or have been verified as credible by MBFC. They review each fact check for accuracy before publishing. In other words, they ***fact-check the fact-checkers and let the reader know their bias***. When appropriate, they explain the rating and/or offer their own rating if they disagree with the fact-checker.

Claim Codes:

- Red**= Fact Check on a Right Claim,
- Blue**= Fact Check on a Left Claim,
- Black**= Not Political/Conspiracy/Pseudoscience/Other

Fact Checker bias rating Codes:

- Red**= Right-Leaning,
- Green** = Least Biased,
- Blue** = Left-Leaning,
- Black**= Unrated by MBFC

Pano News

Pano News is a news *organizer*. It is more of a technology company than a newsroom. They constantly monitor 100+ major news outlets across the political spectrum, aggregating and organizing thousands of articles each day. Their scale allows them to identify overlapping topics and key points across articles, then combine them into what they call Pano stories. And because they keep tabs on both sides of the aisle, Pano stories are uniquely suited to present the facts—and partisan opinions—on news event.

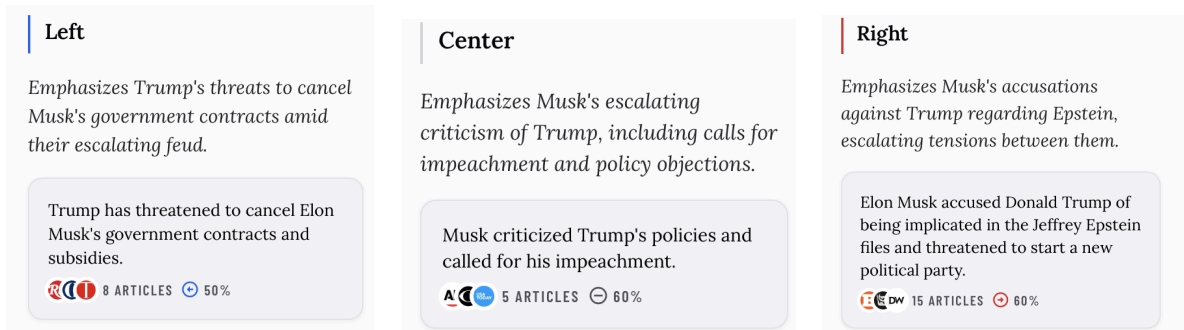

Tangle News

Tangle is a media organization that covers the biggest politics stories in the U.S. by summarizing arguments from the right, center and left (then “our take”).

They provide views from across the political spectrum in every edition, clearly labeling what is opinion and what isn't. It is not “both sidesism” or giving equal weight to conspiracies and facts. Instead, they search the world for the best arguments they can find about the debates of the day, and then they show them to the reader. Side-by-side. So the reader can decide.

They publish a Monday through Thursday newsletter that is free for everyone, and we put our Friday editions behind a paywall.

Here is what comes in the email message:

1. **Today's topic:** The biggest political news story of the day with the basic, indisputable facts in the most neutral language possible.
2. **What the left, right and center are saying:** Tangle provides three arguments from the left and three from the right spanning from the center to more fringe of each side. This way, you get analysis from across the political spectrum.
3. **My take:** As an open-minded political reporter, Isaac Saul shares his honest, unfiltered thoughts about those arguments. This is an act of transparency, so the reader knows a little bit about the process of the people providing the reader with the news.

USA Facts

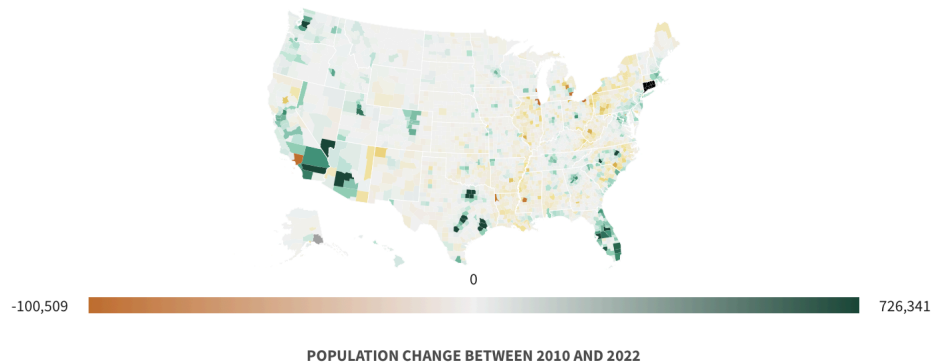

Their weekly newsletter will allow the reader to better understand how the government works, how it's funded, and how it affects American society.

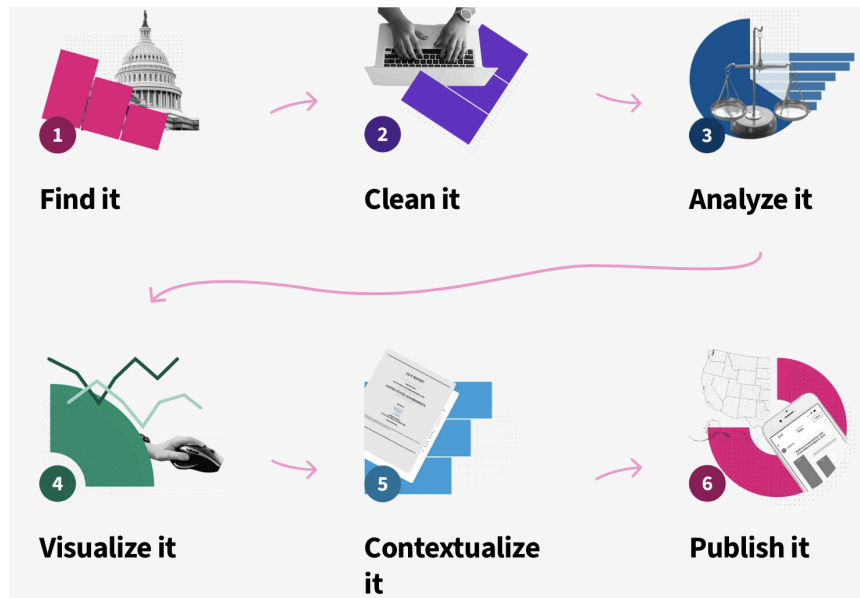
